

July 2016. FONA commemorated the centenary of the Battle of the Somme with a special showing of the remarkable contemporary film created at the time of the battle. This was followed by a fascinating talk from Professor Chris Wrigley, Emeritus Professor of Modern History at the University of Nottingham, who explained the making of the film and highlighted some of the key elements within it.




November 2016.

Founded in 1899, The Victoria County History project was dedicated to Queen Victoria to commemorate her Diamond Jubilee. Its aim was to record the history of every county in England.

In 2012, it was rededicated to HM Queen Elizabeth II in celebration of her Diamond Jubilee year.

Sheila Leeds, one of the team of local researchers, explained the work now being undertaken to complete the volumes on Nottinghamshire.
