



Nottingham in the Great War



In this talk Carol Lovejoy Edwards looked at the impact of the Great War on those left behind at home here in Nottinghamshire - from the food shortages and hardships of coping alone to the new opportunities for women and also the criminal fraternity.

This presentation by Edward Hammond discussed the extent of the impact of the Napoleonic Wars on domestic life in Nottinghamshire during the early 19th century, with a special focus on the Luddites, the Pentrich Revolution and the debate around economic and political motives at the time. There was also an opportunity to view and handle parts of a Napoleonic French infantryman's uniform.
